As part of the orientation exercise, papers were presented by different scholars to guide the students on the rules and regulations of the University they must abide by.

The Head of Department Educational Foundations, Dr. A.A Bagudu, warned the students against cultism, examination malpractice, impersonation, stealing and rioting.

Dr. Bagudu, who presented a paper on Students' Code of Conducts and Ethics in Nigerian Universities, said Students should read and understand the University Code of conducts to serve as a guide to their successful stay in FUDMA.

The University Librarian Dr. Babangida Umar Dangani, who was represented at the occasion by the Assistant librarian Miss. Tihyaunin Dang, presented a paper on the uses of library.


traditional rulers and dignitaries to be present during the graduation ceremony.

Earlier, the FUDMA SPGS Board under the Leadership of the Dean, Prof. Ojonigu Friday Ati, at its 12<sup>th</sup> (regular) and 13<sup>th</sup> (emergency) meeting on 17<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 at new ICT Complex considered SPGS first Semester results for Senate considerations and approval.

Prof. Ojonigu Friday Ati advised all SPGS students to conclude all registration activities before the closing date as complaints relating to registration would not be entertained after the closing date.

## **FUDMA WEAKLY WEATHER REPORT (15<sup>TH</sup> -21<sup>ST</sup> OCTOBER, 2018)**

### **Temperature**

The maximum temperature of 36.9°C was recorded on Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2018 while the minimum temperature of 22.2°C was recorded on Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> October, 2018. The mean temperature for the week was 29.3°C and the Diurnal temperature was 14.7°C. The recording of high temperature was as a result of reduction in cloud cover within the week because of the receding of the rain bearing wind.

### **Wind Direction and Evaporation**

The wind had less dust and dominant wind direction was the Northeast (NE) wind. The evaporation rate for the week was 50.2mm. The recording of high evaporation rate was as a result of high temperature within the week.

### **Relative humidity**

The maximum relative humidity of 93.3% was recorded on Friday and Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> October 2018 respectively, while the minimum relative humidity of 82% was also recorded on Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> October, 2018. The average relative humidity for the week was 89.6%. The recording of high relative humidity was as a result of increase in temperature which led to evaporation.

### **Implications**

The recording of high temperature was as a result of decrease in the cloud cover. The change in the direction of the dominant wind to NE was an indication that the Tropical continental wind was setting in. Therefore, members of the University Community are advised to get their sweaters ready for the forthcoming cold dry season (Harmatta).
